

#### Inside the fence

- ✓ Top Management's main focus is on production and volumes.
- ✓ Lack of adequate in-house knowledge and skills
- ✓ Use of inadequate performance indicators
- Difficult to effectively influence supply chains

#### **Outside the fence**

- Policy frameworks lacking end-user understanding
- ✓ Mistrust and/or lack of collaboration between Governments and industry
- Slow/inadequate progress on developing new technological solutions
- ✓ Limited collaboration between the different supporting organisations.






