

Funding volume NKI 2008 to 2019




Funding of climate action managers as part of the National Climate Initiative

- Climate Action Managers for municipalities are funded through the Local Authorities funding Guideline (LAG), which is part of the National Climate Initiative (NKI)
- With the NKI the Federal Ministry for the Environment promotes and initiates climate protection projects throughout Germany
- A multitude of projects and programmes, ranging from activities for raising energy-awareness and climatefriendly behaviour, the use of efficient technologies and renewable energy, to measures relating to all aspects of climate-friendly mobility are funded
- Climate action managers received about 6 percent of the total funds between 2008 and 2019




Number of climate action managers funded (as of August 2020; by year of



Funding of climate action managers as part of the National Climate Initiative

- Climate Action Managers can be funded for up to five years
- Their main task is to implement the climate action plan of the municipalities and to monitor the implementation
- Specific tasks are very different
- More than 800 climate action managers have been funded up to August 2020
- Usually one staff position or less per municipality is funded
- Evaluation of NKI is essential; however, evaluating climate action managers is a challenge





Research Questions


- Are municipalities with climate action managers more active in climate protection than municipalities without climate action managers?
- Can the effect of the climate action managers' work on the municipalities' climate policies and activities be determined?

The analysis was part of the evaluation of the Local Authorities funding Guideline (LAG), therefore there were two more targets:

- ...to assess the effectiveness of funding, and
- ...to collect arguments for (or against) the hiring of climate action managers for municipalities.






How do you rate your administration in terms of implementing climate protection measures?






Has your city/municipal council decided on a concrete climate action target, i.e. an emissions

reduction target?




Group 2 - former climate action management [n=37]

Group 3 - no climate action management [n=66]






Does your administration have an annual budget for climate action tasks?

Group 3 - no climate action management [n=66]






Does the municipal administration have a panel (e.g. an interdisciplinary working group on climate action, an advisory board, a steering committee) that deals with climate action topics comprehensively?

Group 3 - no climate action management [n=66]






Group 1 only - Municipalities with climate action management [n=162]


Has the significance of climate action increased since the climate action manager was employed?

Has the financial engagement increased as a result of the introduction of the climate action management position?








