- Building on Breukers et al. (2016)









Preliminary results

- Recognition
 - Communities are initiated externally through the Lightness project
 - Inhabitants initially form community based on place of living not on energy
 - Communities' readiness to form an energy community differ largely
- Procedures
 - Challenge to maintain interest (ES)
- Capabilities
 - Lack of digital proficiency (PL)







Discussion

- Recognition is highly important in initial phases of engagement who is the target group?
- Promising tool for assessing justice in the context of developing energy communities - further validation is needed
- More important role of energy communities through EU Directives high potential number of cases which framework can be applied to

 - Bridge between theory of justice and pilot context
